

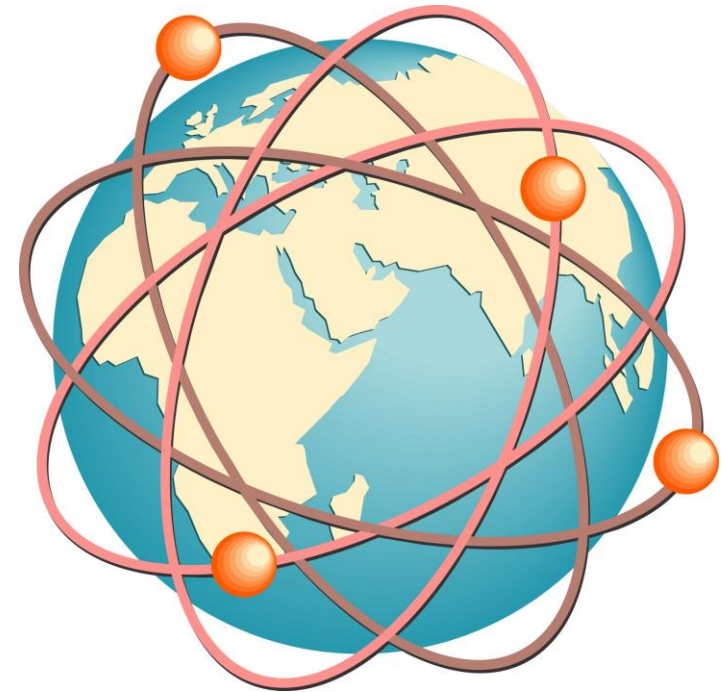

What is Geocaching ?

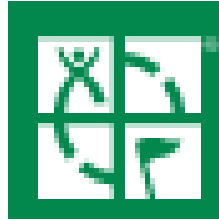
Wikipedia: Geocaching is an outdoor recreational activity, in which participants use a Global Positioning System receiver or mobile device and other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers, called "geocaches" or "caches", at specific locations marked by coordinates all over the world.

How Does The World Geocache ?

Geocache containers are hidden all over the world; on most continents, and in many countries. Geocaching is the same everywhere – the caches are registered with www.geocaching.com and either a "free" version cache or "paid" version cache is hidden. Geocaching is an excellent way to see the world and add more excitement into your travels.

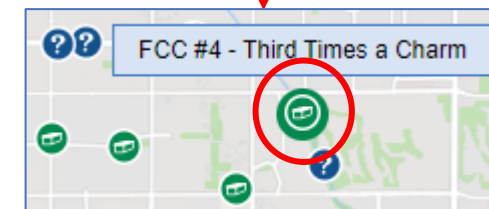
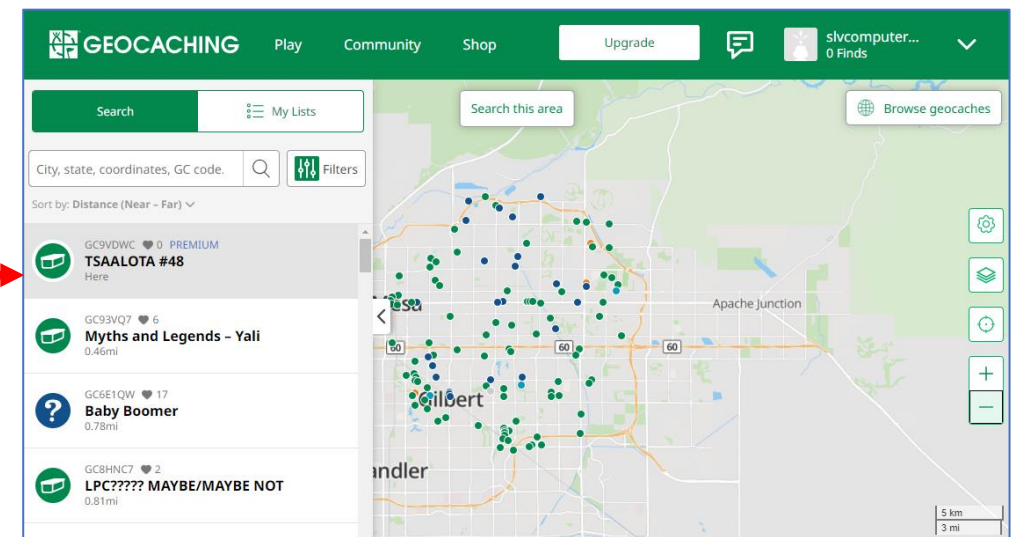
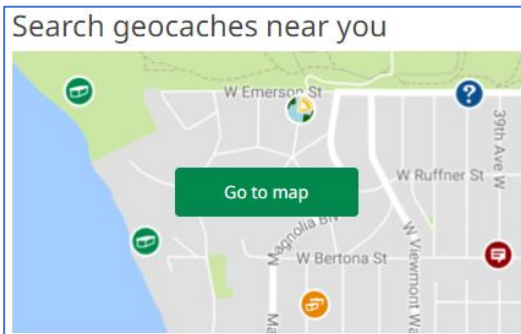
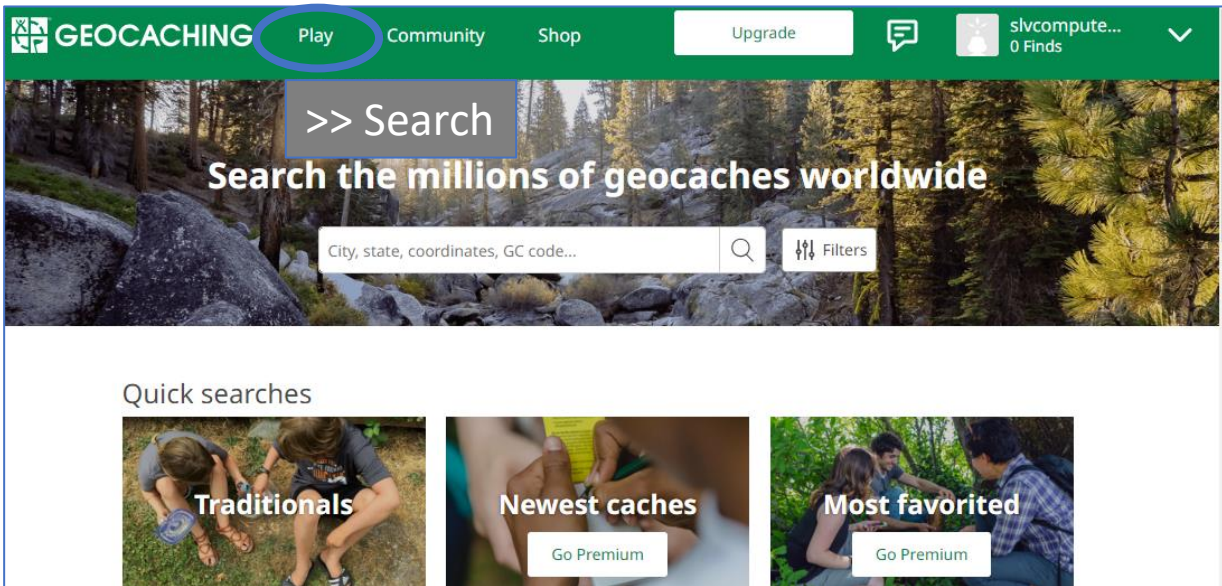


- Goto www.geocaching.com and/or download a Geocache App from The Apple Store or Google Play Store (can also use a GPS Device).

Note: There are over 3,274 geocaches just around Phoenix.

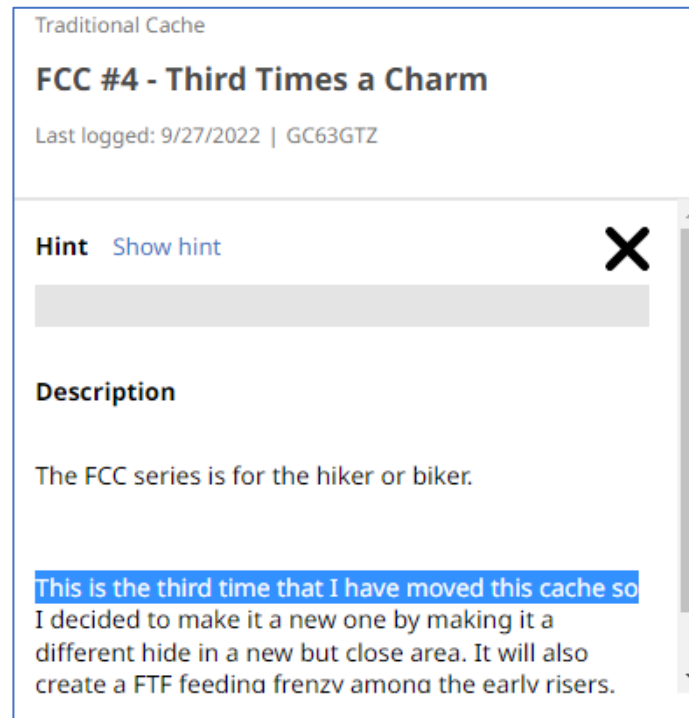
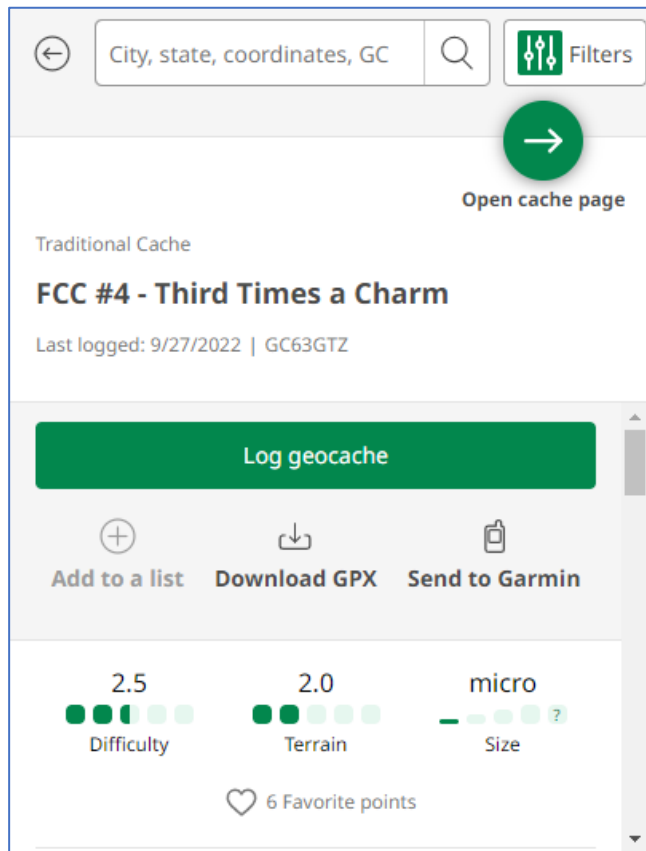

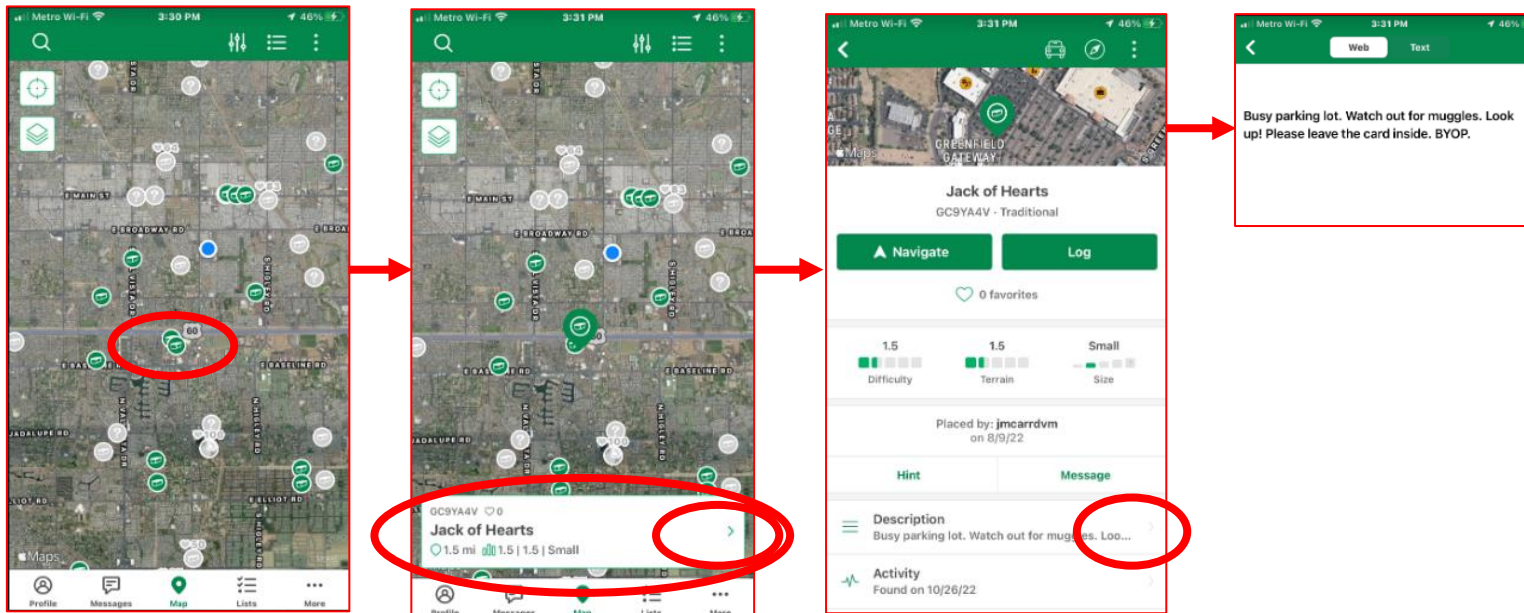

4. Squeeze the map so you see more of the East Valley

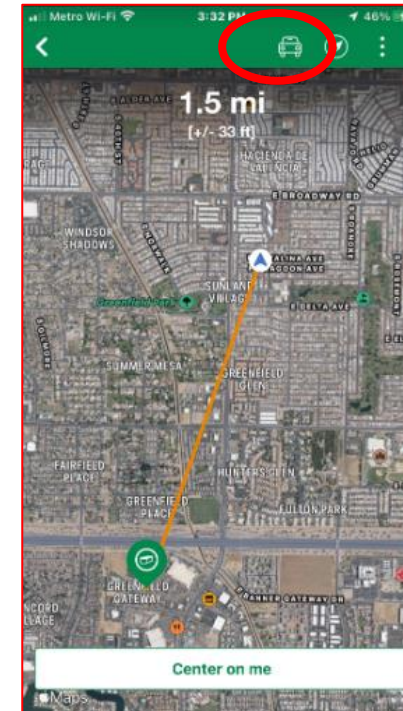
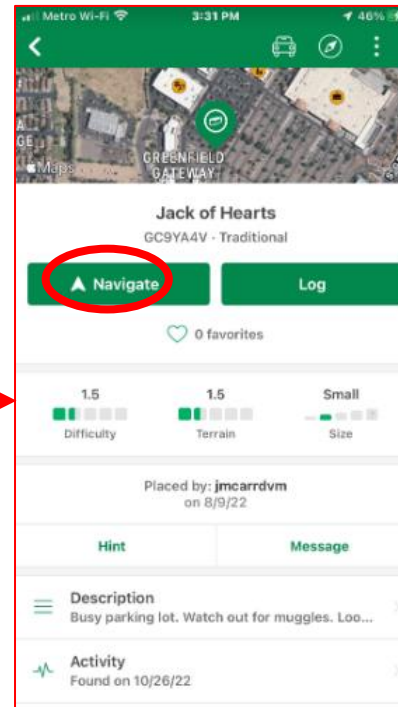
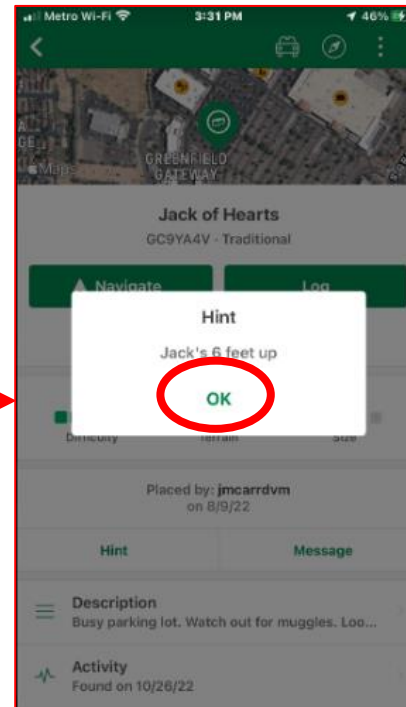
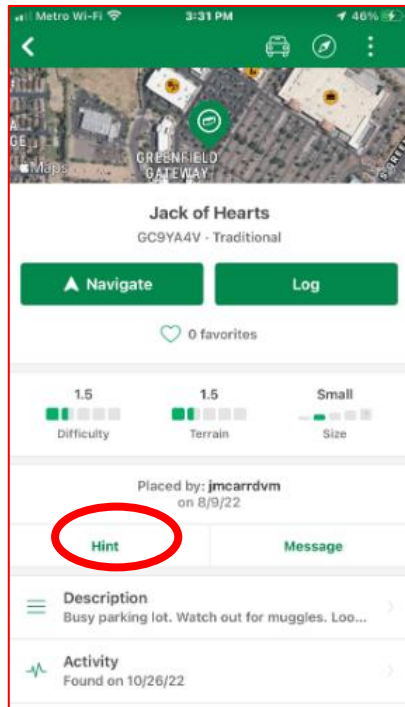

- Select the “search” icon and select the “Location” box. Enter a Location.
 - Tampa, Florida > Search
 - Kingsman, Arizona > Search
 - Then adjust your map to view a wider area

2. Look for something that seems out of place.
3. Geocaches are often disguised.
4. Think like a detective.

8. Check the hint.
9. Watch for previous activity.
10. Be patient. They're out there!

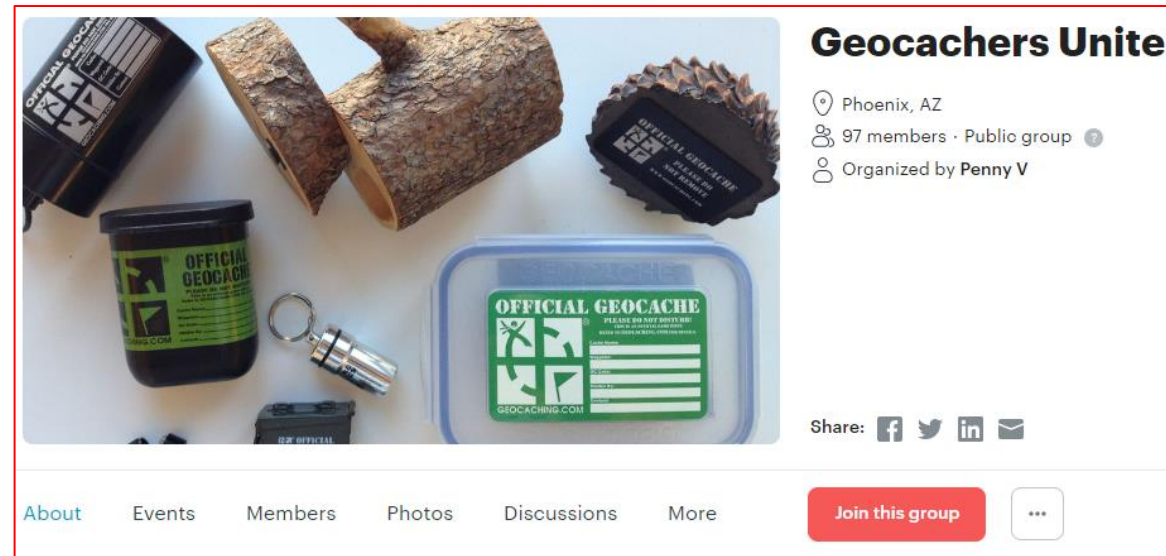
What is geocaching?
