Device Frustrations (And There Are Many)

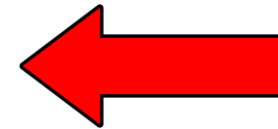
Telephone Interruptions (do I know these people or not) ?

Rules of Thumb

Never Reply

Don't Click On Any Links

Don't Disclose Any Personal Information

Visit An Organizations Website Directly (ie: text from Wells Fargo? Google Search:  [wellsfargo.com](https://www.wellsfargo.com)
<https://www.wellsfargo.com>)

Report The Scammer (iPhone: "Report Junk", Android : Touch & Hold The Text, "Block > Report Spam")




File A Complaint (The FTC "reportfraud.ftc.gov")

Managing All Those Text Messages (this is a start)

 iOS has a feature called **“Filter Messages From Unknown Senders”**

However This Only Works With iMessage. With iMessage, you can prevent unknown senders from texting you directly.

These messages are filtered to another folder, and you don't get notified about them.

- Go to Settings  > Messages 
- Scroll down to Message Filtering, then turn “Filter Unknown Senders.” to ON. 

Managing All Those Text Messages (this is a start)



You can also use **iOS Call Blocker**

However, there might still be unfamiliar messages that could be spam. If you believe they are spam text messages, you can also manually block specific numbers.

1. Tap the **Messages** app.
2. Open the conversation, then tap the number at the top of the conversation.
3. Tap the Profile icon, then tap **Block this Caller**.

Understanding Text Messages (this is a start)



By default, Apple devices use iMessage (Apple's Texting Service)

When you text someone and your words show up as **BLUE**, then you are texting with another Apple device.

When you text someone and your words show up as **GREEN**, then you are testing with an Android device.

However, if you are texting with a group and at least one individual has an Android device, then your words will show up as **GREEN**.

Incoming words are always **WHITE**.

Managing All Those Text Messages (this is a start)



Android has “Spam Protection”

android

- Go to your Messages App
- Click on the 3 dots at the upper right-hand of the screen
- Tap on “Settings” > “Spam Protection”
- Scroll Down To “Enable Spam Protection”
- Swipe the Button to the Right to Turn ON



Managing All Those Text Messages (this is a start)



Android has “Block Contact”

- Go to your Messages App
- Choose the text from the number you want to block
- From the drop down menu, select “Details”
- Tap the option for blocking the number
- Select whether you want to report the text as spam or not
- Click “OK”

Understanding Text Messages (this is a start)



Android texts are Customizable

Settings > Accessibility > Color and Motion (or Text and Display) > Color Correction > Use Color Correction.

Samsung: Settings > Wallpaper & Style (or Wallpaper & Themes)

Android smartphone texts may be governed by your carrier.

Using 3rd Party Apps



There are MANY 3rd Party Apps you can install to manage unwanted phone calls, text messages and emails.
